Rebecca Begtrup, DO

Rebecca Begtrup, DO, MPH, works as one of VMAP's child and adolescent psychiatrists out of Children's National Hospital. Dr. Begtrup completed a triple board residency in 2012 at Tulane University Medical Center in New Orleans, LA in general pediatrics, adult psychiatry, and child and

adolescent psychiatry, where she served as the co-chief resident for two years. She completed a fellowship in eating disorders psychiatry at the University of Maryland and Sheppard Pratt's Center for Eating Disorders in 2013, then continued as an attending psychiatrist supervising trainees and creating a new eating disorders rotation for UMD pediatric interns. She has been at Children's National Hospital since 2016 where she co-founded The Behavioral Health Feeding and Eating Disorders Program. She has also worked as an embedded psychiatrist in the general pediatrics clinic. While her subspecialty focuses on feeding and eating disorders, Dr. Begtrup treats children and adolescents with the full range of mental health concerns. Dr. Begtrup previously worked with the District of Columbia's equivalent program to VMAP, DCMAP, as a child and adolescent psychiatrist consultant.



Adelaide Robb, MD

Adelaide Robb, MD, one of VMAP's child and adolescent psychiatrists, is a psychopharmacologist at Children's National Hospital with ongoing research studies in depression and mood disorders, anxiety, and attention deficit disorder. She is the Chief of the Division of Psychiatry and

Behavioral Sciences. Dr. Robb, who trained at Johns Hopkins University and the National Institutes of Health, has been on the medical staff in the Division of Psychiatry and Behavioral Medicine since 1996, rising to the rank of Professor (with tenure). She is an internationally known clinical researcher and has participated in and led multiple therapeutic trials for children with a variety of behavioral and psychiatric conditions.



Kelly Register-Brown, MD

Kelly Register-Brown, MD, MSc, is one of VMAP's child and adolescent psychiatrists out of Children's National Hospital. She is a board-certified child and adolescent and adult psychiatrist, specializing in the care of young people with autism spectrum disorders. Dr. Register-Brown completed her psychiatry

residency and child and adolescent fellowship at the University of Maryland/Sheppard Pratt. She then joined the faculty of the University of Maryland, working as part of a multidisciplinary team providing support to young people with new diagnosed psychotic disorders. Dr. Register-Brown has also worked as an attending psychiatrist at Brook Lane Health System in Frederick, Maryland. Her interests include emotion processing in people with autism.
